

King Charles prays with Pope Leo

On Thursday 24th October King Charles made a historic visit to the Vatican where he prayed with Pope Leo in the Sistine Chapel. Music was provided by the Sistine Chapel Choir, alongside choristers from the Chapel Royal and St George's Chapel, Windsor. Afterwards, the Pope and the King held a meeting in the Sala Regia with individuals and organisations dedicated to environmental protection. Later they visited the Basilica of St Paul's Outside the Walls. A specially designed chair bearing King Charles's coat of arms and the motto 'Ut Unum Sint' (That they may be One) was used during the ceremony. The chair remains in the Basilica's apse and will be available for use by the King and his successors on future visits.

Michaelangelo's frescoed chapel was filled with a number of ecumenical guests, including the Archbishop of Westminster and President of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, Cardinal Vincent Nichols, and the Archbishop of St Andrews and Edinburgh, Leo Cushley. This visit marked a historic moment in Anglican-Catholic relations—one that has not occurred in 500 years.


