fr. Tom writes...

"There is an obstacle that often prevents us from recognizing Christ's presence in our daily lives: the assumption that joy must be free from suffering. The disciples of Emmaus walk sadly because they hoped for a different ending, for a Messiah who did not know the cross. Although they have heard that the tomb is empty, they cannot smile. But Jesus walks alongside them and patiently helps them understand that pain is not the denial of the promise, but the way through which God has manifested the measure of his love."

This powerful quote can be found in the General Audience that was given last Wednesday by Pope Leo in St Peter's Square. Anyone visiting Rome can apply for a ticket to attend a General Audience, held most Wednesdays, and a summary is always given at the end in English and other major languages, with a full text in English available online soon afterwards. Church doctrine, from era-defining Council documents to short General Audience talks, is one of the great untapped treasures of the Catholic Church which, thanks to the Internet (such a destructive influence in many ways, but still an incredible resource if used with prudence) has never been more accessible.

Did you know, for instance, that there was a significant Vatican document on Artificial Intelligence published in January called *Antiqua et nova*? I was asked to speak about it to the Royal Navy's AI team in Portsmouth this year, so thoughtful is it in applying ancient principles to this brand-new development in human ingenuity. The Church has always valued good reasoning (philosophy) as well as theology, and – armed with both – can think very clearly about the issues of our day. If you want to know why the Church holds the positions it does on subjects like Assisted Suicide, go beneath the headlines and arguments, and read the original documents where it lays out its position. Many documents are addressed to 'people of goodwill'; that is, anyone willing to listen to what the Church has to say.

All Papal (sometimes known as 'Magisterial') documents are free to read and, together with details on how to book tickets for a General Audience for those fortunate enough to go to Rome, can be found on the Vatican's website, Vatican.va. There are also some really interesting Catholic podcasts coming out of America at the moment. I discovered *The Just One Small Thing Podcast* on a car journey recently after dealing with a family member diagnosed with Alzheimer's. It had a really helpful episode on care for the elderly. And Pope Francis's final encyclical, *Dilexit Nos* (He Loved Us), is a superb, life-giving answer to the question: what does it mean when we say God loves us? It's not short, but, as with many of the longer Vatican documents, you can buy a book version in English from the Catholic Truth Society (ctsbooks.org) if you don't want to read online.

Pope Leo XIV recently called for the creation of communities where young people can feel accepted, listened to, and encouraged in their vocational discernment. Our regular gathering for Seeker Saturday gather for exactly that purpose. If you are discerning if the Lord is calling you to the priesthood, diaconate or religious life, then spending time with like-minded people can be really beneficial to any vocational journey. Our time together includes prayer, discussion, Mass, Adoration and lunch too.

Pope Francis once reflected on the significance of discernment, "Discernment is demanding and requires listening to the Lord, to oneself, and to others. It is a process that calls for 'prayer, reflection, patient expectation, and, ultimately, courage and sacrifice'." The Pope also highlighted the joy that comes from making good decisions, stressing that "making a good decision, a right decision, brings us much joy."

He urged that we especially help young people understand that "being free means risking to embark on a particular path, with wisdom and prudence of course, but also with boldness and a spirit of renunciation, in order to grow and advance in self-giving, and thus to find happiness in loving others in accordance with God's plan."

ABORTION UP TO BIRTH - LIFE UK

An update about the major battle we are about to face against the abortion lobby over the Antoniazzi Abortion to Birth Amendment with the Second Reading happening in the House of Lords in the next few weeks.

If the Amendment becomes law, it would no longer be illegal for women to perform their own abortions for any reason - even for sex selection, solely because the baby was a girl and at any moment right up to birth.
