A CATHOLIC FUNERAL

In 2014, Bishop Philip issued to the clergy and people of the Diocese some Guidelines for Funerals and for the Care of the Terminally III. The Guidelines should be followed in our Diocese when planning a funeral for a Catholic person who has died. The leaflet also enables Catholics to leave instructions about their own funeral for their next of kin, and in addition, some notes are given for the care of Catholics who are terminally ill. When a Catholic dies, it is the usual custom of the Catholic Church for them to be brought to their parish church & for a Requiem Mass to be offered up for them. This is the case even for those who during their lifetime rarely practiced their Catholic faith. Catholics believe that when a person dies, it is a priority to offer Mass, because it is the Sacrifice of Christ & in the Mass the Church pleads to the Lord, asking him to forgive the sins and weaknesses of the deceased & to admit them into the communion of the saints. CATECHISTS' DAY

On the 11th of October, three of our parishioners, Ugochi, Anne-Isabelle, and Anthonia, attended the Catechist Day with Bishop Philip Egan at Sacred Heart of Jesus and St Peter the Apostle in Waterlooville. This was part of the ongoing catechists' formation.

Ugochi writes:

The Diocesan Catechist Day – Jubilee for Catechists in Waterlooville was an unforgettable experience, both educative and uplifting, filled with joy, fellowship, and spiritual renewal. The sessions were led by Bishop Philip, supported by a Missionary Sister who shared reflections on living our vocation with humility and joy.



It was a spirit-filled, educative, and joyful day with plenty of learning, reflection, and fellowship. *Bishop Philip* taught us about our mission as catechists, to be witnesses of faith, hope, and love, helping others encounter Christ personally. One of the Missionary Sisters also encouraged us to live our vocation with joy, humility, and compassion.

We explored the journey of catechesis, learned from the teachings of the Popes, and reflected on what it means to be missionaries of hope. The discussions were engaging and insightful, and there were lots of refreshments, food, and drinks shared in unity and joy.

The atmosphere was warm and welcoming. Everyone was nourished spiritually and physically, with plenty to eat and drink, laughter, and meaningful sharing. Overall, it was a memorable and blessed experience, filled with faith, friendship, and inspiration. We left Waterlooville strengthened in our calling as catechists, teachers, witnesses, and missionaries of hope.

NEWSLETTER THOUGHT

The Catechism of the Catholic Church has an excellent treatise on Christian Prayer. It appears in the fourth and final part of the catechism and begins with a summation of the whole faith. What follows are some excerpts directly from the catechism, though it is well worth reading in its entirety:

Part 4 - PRAYER IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

"Great is the mystery of the faith!

The Church professes this mystery in the Apostles' Creed (Part One) and celebrates it in the sacramental liturgy (Part Two), so that the life of the faithful may be conformed to Christ in the Holy Spirit to the glory of God the Father (Part Three).

This mystery, then, requires that the faithful believe in it, that they celebrate it, and that they live from it in a vital and personal relationship with the living and true God. This relationship is prayer.

WHAT IS PRAYER?

"For me, prayer is a surge of the heart; it is a simple look turned toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and of love, embracing both trial and joy." (St. Thérèse of Lisieux)

Prayer as God's gift

"Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God." But when we pray, do we speak from the height of our pride and will, or "out of the depths" of a humble and contrite heart? He who humbles himself will be exalted; humility is the foundation of prayer, Only when we humbly acknowledge that "we do not know how to pray as we ought," are we ready to receive freely the gift of prayer.

Prayer as covenant

Where does prayer come from? Whether prayer is expressed in words or gestures, it is the whole man who prays. But in naming the source of prayer, Scripture speaks sometimes of the soul or the spirit, but most often of the heart (more than a thousand times). According to Scripture, it is the heart that prays. If our heart is far from God, the words of prayer are in vain.

Prayer as communion

In the New Covenant, prayer is the living relationship of the children of God with their Father who is good beyond measure, with his Son Jesus Christ and with the Holy Spirit. The grace of the Kingdom is "the union of the entire holy and royal Trinity . . . with the whole human spirit."

Prayer is Christian insofar as it is communion with Christ and extends throughout the Church, which is his Body. Its dimensions are those of Christ's love.
