## Reflection from Fr Elijah: Rejoice, the Lord is near!

Today, the third Sunday of Advent, *Gaudete* ("Rejoice") Sunday, highlights the joy that comes from knowing the Lord is near. The liturgy emphasizes rejoicing, beginning with the opening prayer asking God to help believers experience the joy of Christ's saving love. The readings echo this theme: Zephaniah urges Israel to shout for joy because God is in their midst as a victorious protector; the psalm continues this call to rejoice; and St. Paul encourages the Philippians to "be always happy in the Lord." In the Gospel, John the Baptist announces the Messiah's imminent arrival and calls people to prepare through justice, generosity, and care for the poor.

Joy is described as transformative and life-giving, much like sunlight on a flower or a child's smile. It is contagious and uplifting. Yet Christian joy is not superficial cheerfulness or forced positivity. It does not ignore suffering or mask pain. As Timothy Radcliffe OP notes, it is not "happy-clappy jollity," nor, in Seamus Heaney's phrase, "the fixed smile of a pre-booked place in Paradise." True joy, as John Catoir explains, is the deep awareness of God's loving presence, a gift of the Holy Spirit.

Christian joy can exist alongside sorrow, anger, and hardship. Believers are called to share Christ's joys and sorrows, and some of the most joyful people are those who have known profound suffering yet encountered God's love within it. This joy is resilient, emerging even in struggle.

Ultimately, we are invited to experience and share a joy that flows from God's tender delight in them. As the psalmist prays, "Let your face shine on us," believers are transformed by God's loving smile. The Church can speak credibly of the Gospel only when it embodies this divine tenderness – the true foundation of authentic Christian joy.
