Scripture Readings at Mass

Isaiah 11:1-10 'With righteousness he shall judge te poor.'

Romans 15:4-9 'Christ saves humanity.'

Matthew 3:1-12 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.'

6/7 December 2025 Fr Tom writes...

At one point in Matthew's Gospel, Jesus says: "The kingdom of heaven is like a grain of mustard seed that a man took and sowed in his field. It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." It is worth meditating on these words in the light of what is going on in 'liturgical time' right now. Mary is heavily pregnant, in her ninth month in fact. The child she carries is God in human form, the Creator of the Universe. We do not hold this to be a metaphor, but the literal, mindboggling and historical truth of what was about to happen in Bethlehem.

And there's more, for the infant she bears is fully human as well as fully divine. In light of Jesus's fingers-and toes physicality, it is hardly less bewildering to consider that this tiny infant, eight months in the womb, who will in time be clothed and fed like any other baby, is also a seed. He is the seed that gave birth to the Church to which we belong, that, for all our imperfections, continues to grow around the world. He is the tree in which we nest, for this baby is not just set to be a Teacher (though he will be that) Truth itself in human form. Not just a prophet, but that which was prophesied by the prophets – for what Mary carries is the Healing of the Nations, Godwith-us. As my father used to say: 'It's too unlikely not to be true!"
