The Call of the Apostles

Jesus begins His public ministry in Galilee, fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah: a great light shines upon a people in darkness. Walking by the Sea of Galilee, He calls ordinary fishermen to follow Him. 'Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him.

Simon Peter and Andrew drop their nets immediately. Then James and John leave their boat—and even their father Zebedee—to join Jesus. Their response is radical and instant: no hesitation, no conditions.

This Sunday's Gospel invites us to reflect on our own call as disciples. Jesus does not seek the perfect or the powerful; He calls everyday people in the midst of their daily work. Like the first Apostles, we are invited to leave behind whatever holds us back—comfort, security, or distractions—and follow Him wholeheartedly.

Jesus' call is personal: He sees us where we are and invites us to something greater. Today, He says the same to us: "Come after me." How will we respond?
