Year A (Cycle II – Psalter Week 3)

Welcome to St Patrick's Church. St John describes Jesus as the light that shines in the darkness. Jesus lightens our darkness, and helps us to see the real meaning of our lives. When called upon, He is also the One who helps us to put aside our differences and lives as brothers and sisters in Him. Christ calls us to follow Him, to enable his light to shine on us and so proclaim the Good News of the kingdom.


