## FOURTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

1st February 2026 AD

Year A (Cycle II – Psalter Week 4)

Welcome to St Patrick's Church. Today's Gospel is from St Matthew's memorable account of Jesus' *Sermon on the Mount*. We are asked to take particular account of the line "Blessed are the poor in spirit". In the beatitudes, Jesus tells us how blessed we are if poor in spirit because the kingdom of heaven will be ours. Poverty of spirit means putting Jesus first in everything. Not believing that we are good enough on our own. We are rich in Him when we recognise that everything of lasting worth comes from Him.

**NOTICES:**

 **After Mass this morning** there will be a short rite for the choir and others who wish to take part honouring **St Blaise**. St Blaise was a doctor in Sebaste in Armenia, of miraculous ability, good-will, and piety. He was elected bishop of the city with the acclamation of all the people. In 316, Agricola, the governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia, having arrived in Sebastia at the order of the emperor Licinius to kill the Christians, arrested him. As he was being led to jail, a mother set her only son, choking to death of a fish-bone, at his feet, and the child was cured straight away. Regardless, the governor, unable to make Blaise renounce his faith, beat him with a stick, ripped his flesh with iron combs, and beheaded him. On his feast, candles are held in the form of a cross by a priest over the throat and the following blessing is given: "Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness". Then the priest makes the sign of the cross over the faithful.

 **2nd February** is the **Feast of the Presentation the Our Lord** (Candlemass) which is of Oriental origin. It was known in the West as the feast of the Purification of Our Lady, and closed the Christmas Cycle, forty days after the Lord's birth. We celebrate with solemn blessings and processions of candles. The Presentation of the Lord concludes the celebration of the Nativity and with the offerings of the Virgin Mother and the prophecy of Simeon. **Mass** will be celebrated at **12:00noon** at **St Joseph's, Havant**.

 **For All Medical and Healthcare Professionals** (and those who pray for them. On Friday **13th February** (**The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes**) at **6:30pm**, there will be a mass at **St Colman's, Cosham** especially for Medics. Doctors, Nurses. Healthcare Assistants, Ambulance Crews, and all who work in Auxiliary roles and healthcare professions are invited to this mass. 

 **2026 Pilgrimage with Bishop Philip to Lourdes.** The pilgrimage will start at London Heathrow Airport on Monday **6th July** and run until Friday **10th July**. Accommodation will be at the *Hotel La Solitude*, which is close to the Sanctuary itself. During the pilgrimage you will be able to enjoy all that Lourdes has to offer, taking part in all the usual Pilgrimage activities as well as visits to many places that were important to St Bernadette. There are also opportunities to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. There will be moments of quiet reflection and peace, and others when we will be able to hear the chanting and singing of hundreds of voices. **We have three Alpha courses running** from the first week in March, starting:


