Prayer of England

O blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God and our most gentle Queen and Mother, look down in mercy upon England thy "Dowry" and upon us all who greatly hope and trust in thee.

By thee it was that Jesus our Saviour and our hope was given unto the world; and He has given thee to us that we might hope still more.

Plead for us thy children, whom thou didst receive and accept at the foot of the Cross, O sorrowful Mother. Intercede for our separated brethren, that with us in the one true fold they may be united to the supreme Shepherd, the Vicar of thy Son.

Pray for us all, dear Mother, that by faith fruitful in good works we may all deserve to see and praise God, together with thee, in our heavenly home. Amen

We are coming to the end of our week of prayer for Christian unity. I would like to talk about the importance of this. Particularly from a Catholic perspective. Through life my perspective has ranged from thinking we are all the same to what difference does it make. After all Jesus came for all. I have also thought that Salvation comes from the Catholic Church. I have also met many Holy and devout people from different denominations and their Love of Jesus Shines forth.

Let's start with the fact that our faith is the most precious gift even when it seems fragile. The fullness of truth is contained fully in our Catholic Faith. Which means we are confined to it and humbly should surrender to it and through it to the will of God through Jesus Christ and His body the Church. However, this is for our salvation. Although desired by God it adds absolutely nothing to Him. Which means God's reach is not confined by this, but we should be.

From the earliest times of the Church, it has taught against error and preserved a consistence message. Its style and manner of messaging may have changed to suite the times. Its understanding may have deepened and broadened. Still the message has not changed. We can be certain of this because of the extant writings we have external of Scripture contained in the writings of the Church Fathers from the 1st Century onwards. So, we can be confident in what Our Faith professes.

Over time their human nature led to fractures from the Church. The fracture of East and West and more significantly the reformation. Some 500 years ago. Since then, there are now over 30 000 Christian religions with little cohesion. They can't all be right. So how do we as Catholics view this particularly when we profess One Holy and Catholic Church every week at mass.

We know there are aspects of our Faith that are non-negotiable like The Eucharist being the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ Himself. So, it would be logical to conclude that we cannot have Christian Unity unless it is through the Eucharist.

What we look to and where we can work together is in Christian Outreach to the poor and marginalised. We can meet and find commonality in the truths that they have taken with them. For example, it could be argued that many of our Christian sisters and brothers have made scripture an essential part of their daily lives to our embarrassment. This is a good thing without a doubt. Borne out in part as their rejection of the Eucharist in the liturgy led to a greater focus on Scripture. Sadly, however it is the cry of scripture alone that has led to the endless fracturing since the reformation that has led to tens of thousands of unresolved disputes. This is bound to happen when the authority of the Church is dismissed and assumed by the individual.

We should stand with our Christian family. Living in the truth and for a reconciliation of the Church into the one true fold of the Church lived since its founding by Jesus Christ.


