Sunday 25 January 2026 : 3rd Sunday & Conversion of St Paul

What is our mental image of Galilee in Jesus' time? How do we imagine the scene of most of Jesus' life and ministry when we read about it in the Gospels? For many of us, the picture will be a scene of bucolic tranquillity, a calm and unhurried country of honest people, far from the politics and danger of Jerusalem. In the words of one of our hymns, "O Sabbath rest by Galilee, O calm of hills above!" Yet for much of Biblical history, Galilee was a theatre of war. In our first reading today (Isaiah 9:1-4), when thinking about Galilee, the Prophet Isaiah recalls the "Day of Midian", a reference to Gideon's victory over the vast army of the Midianites (Judges 7). At the Lord's express direction, Gideon had selected a tiny force of just 300 men for the battle; he prevailed not by strength but by guile. In today's Gospel (Matthew 4:12-23) Jesus fulfils the type of Gideon, choosing a small and unpromising band of fishermen to begin the awesome work of bringing about the Kingdom of God. To think that these few simple rustics would perform miracles and convert the world reminds us that the victory belongs to the Lord, as Gideon himself knew well.
