Sermon of Jesus Christ on the Mount
by Edouard Louis Dubufe 1844

Today's liturgy centres on the profound gift of human freedom and the transformative power of God's law. In the first reading from Sirach, we are reminded that God has set before us 'fire and water,' life and death. We are not mere spectators in our spiritual lives; we are active participants who must choose to stretch out our hands toward the good.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus continues the Sermon on the Mount by teaching that He has come not to abolish the Law, but to fulfil it. He invites us to move beyond a 'legalistic' faith—one that only checks off external requirements—and toward a 'righteousness that exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees.' This higher righteousness is a matter of the heart.

Jesus takes the Commandments we know and deepens them. It is no longer enough to avoid the act of murder; we must now confront the anger and resentment that precede it. It is not enough to avoid adultery; we must guard the purity of our intentions and thoughts. This is the 'hidden wisdom' St. Paul describes to the Corinthians—a wisdom that requires the guidance of the Holy Spirit to understand and live out. Our 'Yes' must mean 'Yes' and our 'No' must mean 'No.' By living with this radical integrity, we reflect the light of Christ. This week, we are called to examine our inner lives, asking the Lord to purify our motives and help us choose the path of life in every word and action.

Fasting and Abstinence During Lent

Lent is a sacred season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that prepares us to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord at Easter. Through fasting and abstinence, the Church invites us to practice self-discipline, grow in solidarity with those in need, and make room in our hearts for God.

Fasting is required of Catholics ages 18–59 on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On days of fasting, one full meal is permitted, along with two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal. Abstinence from meat is required of Catholics age 14 and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent.

These practices are not meant to be burdensome but freeing us and helping us detach from excess and turn more fully toward Christ. Those who are ill, pregnant, elderly, or otherwise unable to fast are excused and encouraged to choose another form of penance or charity. As we journey through Lent, may our fasting and abstinence deepen our prayer, strengthen our compassion, and draw us closer to the love and mercy of God.
