Fr. Tom writes...

For those of you looking for some good reading over Lent, here are some recommendations:

1. The Imitation of Christ by Thomas a Kempis If you feel in need a bit of a work-out, spiritually speaking, this 14th Century classic is almost unsurpassed as an antidote to worldliness, dread, and pretty much every delusion from self-pity to self-importance. As a girl, Therese of Lisieux could cite much of it by heart, and Padre Pio had a line from it above his cell door. Evelyn Waugh once warned of this book that if you enjoyed reading it you probably hadn't understood it. Not a long read, but difficult to forget.
2. A Song for Nagasaki by Paul Glynn Hands down one of the most moving stories I've ever read. Takashi Nagai was a professor at Nagasaki University and, having fallen in love with a Japanese Catholic girl as an undergraduate, a convert to the faith. Nagasaki was and still is the heart of Japanese Catholicism. In an instant, Tagashi lost his wife, and 4000 of his neighbours. The faith and humility he found in the aftermath is utterly inspiring. There is an ongoing Cause for the Beatification of both Takashi and his wife, Midori.
3. Alone with Christ Alone – Sr. Clare Crockett This is not available from Amazon etc., but can be obtained from her Order (www.sisterclare.com). If you enjoyed the documentary about this Irish nun on Youtube (*Sister Clare Crockett – All or Nothing*), which I recommended last year, this is an excellent companion, containing her correspondence with her spiritual director, and confirming the remarkable holiness of this former party girl and actress. As with Takashi, there is a now a Cause open for her Beatification. If you think the young have given up on Church, get to know Clare Crockett and her stunning, timeless smile.
4. Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist by Brandt Pitre Pitre is perhaps the best Catholic Biblical scholars of his generation, and here he describes meeting his father-in-law for the first time, a Baptist preacher horrified at the idea of his daughter marrying a Catholic. He challenged Pitre on the Catholic doctrine of the Eucharist, prompting Pitre to dive deep into the Old Testament world of sacrificial worship from which the Holy Mass draws so much of its Biblical resonance. A brilliant and very readable response to his father-in-law.
5. Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church Promulgated in 2006 after requests for a shorter version of the epochal Catechism of the Catholic Church (1992), this is a masterpiece in its own right. Not dumbed down; but distilled. One of the great principles of Catholic theology is "the connection of the mysteries to each other," and the Compendium runs through the same great questions as its bigger brother: What is God? What is the Church? What are Human Beings? What is Prayer? This is life-giving catechesis and written for anyone willing to concentrate. Happy reading!
