FR MARK WRITES: HEARING WITH OUR HEARTS

God's Word reaches our ears, but it takes root uniquely in each heart that is willing to listen.

Most of us have heard of optical illusions, but there's also something called an auditory illusion. Even in everyday situations, though, it's remarkable how two people can hear the exact same thing and yet walk away with completely different understandings. When you hear the Scripture readings at Mass, it's safe to say that you will hear them in a way that is distinct. They will be the same readings but you will hear something different to the person sat next to you or behind you.

If that is true of *hearing*, then it's even more true of *listening*. When you actively focus and pay attention to what you hear at Mass, you will discover the unique message that the Lord gives you, received with the Church's faith, through the Scripture.

What are you listening for when you come to Mass? Inspiration? Direction? A line to lift you up? The words of Jesus? What are you listening for? What *should* you be listening for? We can all walk away hearing different things, but what's most important is not *what we hear but how we listen*.

After the Introductory Rites, we enter the Liturgy of the Word. **'Liturgy' means the work of the people.** So, it's not a moment for passive spectators. Our work at this point is to listen.

How do we become better listeners? Well, it helps to know what you are listening to.

The Mass is, in large part, the Bible coming to life before us. The prayers, responses, symbols and Eucharist all have their roots in Scripture. The Bible is God's revelation to us. It is our story. Written by many authors over many centuries, it tells of God's relationship with his people and his plan of salvation.

At a typical Sunday Mass, we hear an Old Testament reading, a Responsorial Psalm, a New Testament reading and a Gospel passage. These readings come from a three-year cycle called the Lectionary, which allows us to hear a great portion of the Bible over time.

The Bible really is our story. We realize it's our story because the same God that created Adam and Eve created you and me. We see our own struggles, hopes, failures and victories reflected in the lives of the people we meet in Scripture. Above all, it is our story because Jesus came for each one of us. When we come to Mass, we do not simply hear ancient stories; we hear *our* story.

Our story continues with the 'homily'. Its purpose is not simply to inform but to elicit a response. It determines the direction of the people and the parish. It can make or break your experience of Mass and even change your life. Fr Pedro and the deacons and I spend a lot of time working on messages because we believe in the power of the homily to transform lives.

Listening is hearing with heart. Sound enters through the ears and passes through the mind, but faith asks it to travel further still, from the head to the heart. That is where the Word finds rich soil and takes root.

Like a seed, God's Word needs to be nurtured. We cannot simply scatter it and expect growth. We must make room for it, water it, feed it, tend it and remove whatever prevents it from flourishing. So ask yourself: *What is preventing me from listening to God with my whole heart today?*

Hearing with heart is removing the barriers that keep God's Word from taking root within us.

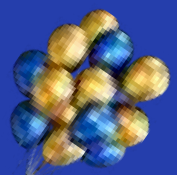
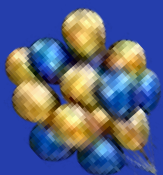
