Fr. Tom writes...

A warm welcome to Fr Andrew, who will be introducing himself on this page next week. For now, another reflection from me. This coming Monday is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. For Carmelites like St Therese of Lisieux, this would traditionally mark the beginning of what one might call a super-Lent. Although they would break to honour such glorious moments as the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and the Octave of Christmas itself, this nonetheless marked the beginning of a fast that ran all the way to Easter Morning. Now, they only ever ate fish, instead of meat, and I don't think indulgent snacks were exactly a problem for them for the rest of the year, so an outsider might have struggled to notice the difference. But they did. This launched them interiorly into preparation for that most sacred of all prayers – the 3-Day (in Latin 'Triduum') liturgy that leads from the Last Supper, through Good Friday, to an encounter with the Resurrected Christ.

At a time when the basic structures of society (family life, political stability, even the meteorological seasons) seem newly fragile, the Church continues to give us the same liturgical year, in all its redemptive power. And, put simply, the more we engage with it, the more it will provide us with the stamina and sanity (and supernatural joy!) we long for. Having a little Catholic pocket diary, or an app like Hallow or Universalis, means always being conscious of where one is, sensing the company of the inspiring saints that dot the path, and the moments when the Church calls us to stop and be still. Carmelites prepare like this because they take Jesus seriously. Their whole life revolves around his gift of eternal life to us, like the earth around the sun. There is nothing more beautiful. They may seem to us like Olympic athletes of the spiritual world, and in many ways they are, but is Jesus not the centre of our lives too? And, in our own way, can we not emulate them?

This Sunday is Education Sunday

In his message for Education Sunday, The Rt Rev Marcus Stock, Bishop of Leeds and Chairman of the Catholic Education Service, encourages us to pray for all those involved in Catholic education as a new academic year begins. He invites us to give thanks for teachers, support staff, chaplains, leaders and governors, and to reflect on the Gospel message of forgiveness. During this Jubilee Year of St Francis of Assisi, he also asks us to be inspired by the Saint's example of peace, simplicity, service to the poor and care for creation.

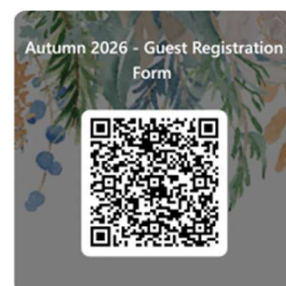

Visit of the Relics of St Gerard Majella

There will also be an opportunity to receive a blessing with the relics after Mass. St. Gerard is the patron saint of mothers, couples trying to conceive, those seeking work and those wishing to make a good confession. This is a wonderful opportunity to come and pray with the relics of this much-loved saint and all are warmly welcome.

Important Information on the Car Park at St Joseph's, Havant

To deter unauthorised parking in St Joseph's Church Car Park, a new parking system will be enforced from 1st October 2026. Management of the system will be undertaken by Horizon Parking Limited who are under contract by Portsmouth Diocese. Many parishioners will have encountered similar systems at the Cathedral and in other Portsmouth Diocese parishes.

Parishioners with key roles and volunteers who are likely to be regularly requiring longer duration parking, should apply to the parish office for permanent authorisation.

Key Points:

- Your vehicle registration number will be automatically captured on entry and exit from the car park and the corresponding times noted by the parking system.
- Maximum stay from 8.00 am to 6.00 pm is 3 hours.
- Maximum stay after 6.00 pm is 1 hour.
- If attending an event and requiring longer than the maximum stay, please enter your registration number in the parking tablet sited in the hall or church.
- Vehicles parked for longer than the maximum stay and not authorised for longer parking via the tablet, or otherwise, will be charged by the Management Company Horizon Parking Limited in accordance with the Terms and Conditions displayed in the car park.

Admittance to Hospital?

When a Catholic is admitted to hospital, the family should ensure that the Catholic Chaplaincy is contacted so that appropriate support can be given. It is suggested that the patient have a note to give to hospital staff on admission, notifying staff that they are Catholic and would appreciate the Catholic Chaplaincy service. This could be followed up by a telephone call from the family to the ward to ensure the request is actioned. When a person is due to go into hospital, please also let your parish priest know so that he can administer the Sacrament of the Sick where appropriate.
